Monthly Report**

July 2010

Activities

- The July 4th celebrations in town were for the most part crime-free with no substantial law violations and few illegal fireworks incidents.
- A new police vehicle was received into inventory in late July, to replace the Sergeant's current SUV, a Ford Expedition. The Expedition will be transferred to the Fire Department in late August or early September.
- Events attended for the month included a meeting with Child Protective Services concerning potential at-risk child safety cases and participation in the Caltrans-sponsored Community Input meeting for the Market Street traffic calming options.

Statistics

- There were 522 calls for service, up from 466 in June.
- There were 61 documented case investigations, with 49 cases concerning criminal activity. There was one traffic collision reported in the month.
- Eighteen in-custody arrests (people went to jail) were made during the month, including five DUI (including a bicycle DUI and one involving a traffic accident), one drug arrests and one arrest for child endangerment.
- There were 114 traffic citations issued in the month, with 54 being moving violations, 13 driver license violations (either unlicensed or suspended license violations) and 47 mechanical violations. The lead moving violations for July were cell phone use, stop sign violations and speeding.
