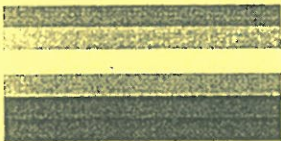

## Frequently asked questions

### Can you help me?

*We will ask you to fill out an intake in our office or by telephone to see if you are eligible for our services.*

### What types of legal assistance do you offer?

*We provide legal assistance most frequently in the areas listed to the left. We will review your intake to determine if we can help you. We do not provide assistance with criminal law, family law, many real estate issues, or with wills, probate, and estate law.*

### What other services do you offer?

*We hold free tenants' rights clinics, which are open to tenants and to landlords*

- *Mondays 3:00 p.m. (Spanish)*

*We also hold free workers' rights clinics, which are open to the public.*

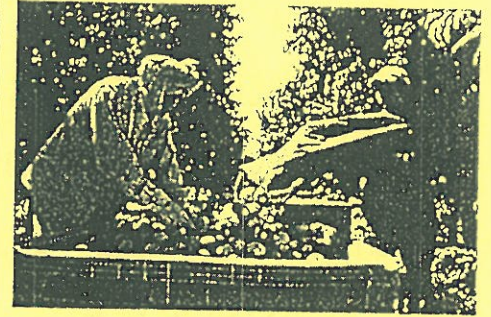
- *2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesdays of the month at 4 p.m. (English and Spanish)*
